#### 3. Article X is added and is to read as follows:

"In case of dissolution of the Corporation liquidation of its affairs, any money or other assets remaining after payment of all obligations shall be distributed in such a manner as the Board of Directors may determine to another tax exempt organization or organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Guam Territorial Income Tax Law."

#### ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLE I

The name of this Corporation shall be the Guam Chapter, Association of Government Accountants. Its principal office is located in Agana, Guam. It is an independent affiliate of other similar chapters worldwide and of the National Office. Association of Government Accountants, 727 So. 23rd St., Suite 100, Arlington, Virginia 22202.

#### ARTICLE II

#### Section 1

The purposes of the Corporation are:

- To unite professional financial a. managers in the Government Service for constructive endeavors.
- To encourage and provide a means for free interchange of ideas among financial managers in the Government service.
- To foster improvement in financial management in the Government through:
- (1) Contributing to the advancement of financial management principles and standards.
- (2) Promoting appropriate utilization of financial management methods and techniques to improve management control and accountability to the public.
- Furthering (3) the observance of professional standards and criteria in the accomplishment of financial management activities.

- d. To contribute to the improvement of education in the field of Government financial management.
- e. To enhance the professional image of financial managers and management in Government service.
- f. To encourage expansion and improvement of service to the public.

#### Section 2

This Corporation shall have and exercise all rights and powers conferred on corporations under the territory of Guam, including the power to contract, rent, buy and sell personal or real property; provided, however, that this Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activity or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Section I of Article II.

#### ARTICLE III

This Corporation is organized pursuant to the Corporation Law of the territory of Guam.

This Corporation is not organized, nor shall it be operated, for pecuniary gain or profit purposes. No part of the profits or net income of this Corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private shareholder, member, or individual.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### Section 1 - Requirements for Membership

a. <u>Full Membership</u> - This class of membership requires six

or more years of Government experience acceptable to the Membership Committee, involving the professional performance of financial management activities in an administrative, supervisory and/or operational capacity. This class is also available to individuals with similar experience outside the Government who are engaged in educational or private industrial activities having the same objectives as the Corporation, or who have made a contribution toward the improvement of financial management in Government. Retired from Government members are included in this class.

- b. <u>Associate Membership</u> This class of membership is available to individuals whose experience does not meet the quantitative and/or qualitative requirements for full membership. Special associate (first year in Government) is included in this class.
- c. <u>Dues</u> All members shall be subject to annual dues prescribed by the Board of Directors.

#### Section 2 - Revocation or Suspension of Membership

Membership may be revoked or suspended by the Board of Directors only. If the Corporative membership committee determines that any member has acted detrimentally to the objectives of the Corporation, as set forth in the By-Laws, or violated the Corporation's Code of Ethics, they shall furnish the Board of Directors with the complete details of the situation.

Membership may also be revoked for nonpayment of dues.

#### ARTICLE V

#### Section 1

The powers of this Corporation shall be exercised by the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall transact all of the Corporation's business.

#### Section 2

The Board of Directors shall consist of <u>five officers and</u> <u>four to seven directors</u>, as provided by the Corporation By-Laws. The number of directors may be changed by amending these Articles or the By-Laws. The By-Laws shall provide for the time, manner of selection, qualifications, terms of office and official designation of officers and directors. Meetings of the Board of Directors will be held as shall be provided in the By-Laws.

#### ARTICLE VI

Provision shall be made in the By-Laws for the selection or appointment of officers and directors.

#### ARTICLE VII

By-Laws shall be adopted by the members at a meeting of the Corporation where at least 10 days advance notice of such a meeting has been given each member and where at least 20 percent of the membership is in attendance or represented by written ballot or duly executed proxy. Two-thirds of those voting must vote for adoption.

#### ARTICLE VIII

This Corporation is being formed in order to incorporate the Guam Chapter, Association of Government Accountants, a previously unincorporated association. The officers and directors of that

association are hereby appointed to serve as the first Board of Directors of this Corporation. All of those elected in accordance with the By-Laws of that association shall serve the term for which they were elected in like offices for this Corporation and their successors, if any, shall be elected in accordance with the provisions of these Articles and the By-Laws adopted hereunder.
